
#### FlashY Words

#### What are Suffixes?

- Suffixes are small parts (or chunks) added to the ends of words.
- Adding suffixes often changes word meaning or usage and may change word spelling or pronunciation.
- Learning suffixes will help you read <u>and</u> spell longer words.
- Learning suffixes will help you recognize longer words you may have heard or already know!

#### **Most Common Suffixes**

There are many suffixes in the English language. The eight slide sets focus on the most common (besides -s/es, -ed, -ing, -er/est) one at a time:

## Suffix -y

- -y sounds like /long ē/ at the end of words and forms mostly familiar or basic adjectives
- -y means "tends to have or look or smell like" (cloudy=tends to have clouds)
- If the base word has a short vowel sound, the final consonant is doubled (fun=funny).
- If the base word ends in silent e, it is dropped (flake=flaky). This only happens sometimes.

# Alphabetical Familiar -y Words (note + before y chunk)

bush+y	tends to look like a bush	
cloud+y	tends to have clouds	
creep+y	tends to look odd or scary	
curl+y	tends to have curls	
dirt+y	tends to have dirt	

# Alphabetical Familiar -y Words (\*note spelling changes)

dump+y	tends to look old or rundown
earth+y	tends to look or smell like the earth
fish+y	tends to smell like fish or be untrue
flabb+y*	tends to have flab or fat
flak+y*	tends to flake or fall apart

# Alphabetical Familiar -y Words (\*note spelling changes)

flash+y	tends to have lots of flash or color
flopp+y*	tends to flop or be soft and limp
fogg+y*	tends to have fog or wet air
funn+y*	tends to make you laugh
furr+y*	tends to have lots of fur

# Alphabetical Familiar -y Words (note + before y chunk)

greed+y	tends to always want or need
hair+y	tends to have lots of hair
health+y	tends to have good health
itch+y	tends to need scratching
jump+y	tends to jump or move a lot

# Alphabetical Familiar -y Words (note + before y chunk)

length+y	tends to be long in length
luck+y	tends to have lots of good luck
mess+y	tends to have many messes
might+y	tends to be strong or powerful
milk+y	tends to have milk or white color

# Alphabetical Familiar -y Words (\*note spelling changes)

mudd+y*	tends to have lots of mud
mugg+y*	tends to be hot and wet
rain+y	tends to rain a lot
seed+y	tends to have seeds or be rundown
shak+y*	tends to shake a lot

## Alphabetical Familiar -y Words (\*note spelling changes)

shin+y*	tends to have shine or gloss
show+y	tends to be fancy or flashy
skinn+y*	tends to be very thin
slim+y*	tends to have slime or goo
smok+y*	tends to have lots of smoke

# Alphabetical Familiar -y Words (note + before y chunk)

rain+y	tends to have a lot of rain
risk+y	tends to have risk or danger
rust+y	tends to have rust
sand+y	tends to have lots of sand
sleep+y	tends to be tired or ready for sleep

blotch+y	tends to have blotches or spots
brain+y	tends to be very smart
brawn+y	tends to be strong or muscular
creak+y	tends to creak or make noise
drear+y	tends to be sad, gray, or dark

# Optional -y Words (\*note spelling changes)

flirt+y	tends to show a like for someone
gawk+y	tends to be clumsy
grogg+y*	tends to be sleepy
gush+y	tends to say too much
jerk+y	tends to move with starts and stops

# Optional -y Words (\*note spelling changes)

loon+y	tends to be silly or crazy
scrapp+y*	tends to argue or fight
scruff+y	tends to me messy or shaggy
spotch+y	tends to have spots or marks
stock+y	tends to be short and heavy
